More spaces available on Care Navigation Training

There are still spaces on the care navigation training which runs until 31 March 2024. This training is aimed predominantly at reception staff and care navigators involved in triaging requests. On completion, individuals will be confident to communicate effectively with patients and be able to signpost to the most relevant team member or local services depending on patient needs.

Places are no longer limited to one per practice, so even if you have already had a team member attend, you may apply for more places.

The Learning Organisation approval process assesses your Learning Organisation (usually over a PCN footprint) via submission of appropriate evidence and a visiting panel (via MS Teams). This will result in a recommendation to the NHSE (formally HEE) Quality Assurance Group for Primary Care Learners regarding the suitability to become an approved NHSE (formally HEE) Learning Organisation. This would enable the Learning Organisation to host placements for all multidisciplinary learners.

The <u>Primary Care Learning Organisation Toolkit</u> sets out the new approval process, procedure and documents. Further information including helpful facts can be found <u>here</u>. We have approved 4 Learning Organisations to date in BSW and are due to complete this over the next 5 years.

Dr Will Wallage (Primary Care Associate Dean for Quality NHSE South West and BSW Training Hub GP Lead) and Rachel Cooke (Governance/Quality Admin Lead) are in the process of contacting PCN Clinical Directors / PCN Managers for a 30–40-minute informal chat to outline the Learning Organisation process and answer any questions. Advanced Practice Training Support: Are you in danger of paying out money you might not need to?

Each year NHSE offer support funds to train Advanced Clinical Practitioners (Nurses, Paramedics, Pharmacists, AHPs), to the tune of £8600* per trainee per year of training. For a new trainee embarking on a 3-year ACP Apprenticeship that works out at £25,800 per trainee. In addition to this, by <u>applying for an Apprenticeship Levy</u> <u>Transfer via the BSW Apprenticeship</u> <u>Network</u>, the course fees are also fully covered.
