BECOME A VISA

The Training Hub has obtained a number of licences for the 'Hot Topics' courses offered by NB Medical. These are for staff who are eligible for the CPD funding* from NHSE which is held by the Training Hub. If you fit the criteria and have not yet fully used your CPD allowance for this year, you may wish to take advantage of one of these subscriptions. **If you are interested in this, please contact bswicb.traininghub@nhs.net, giving your name, role, and the name of your practice/PCN.*** 'Eligible' staff are Registered *Nurses, Nursing Associates, Physiotherapists, Paramedics, Podiatrists and Therapists who are employed in BSW practices.*

Funding to become a Visa Sponsorship Practice! Hurry! 3 spaces left!

Over half of the doctors in GP training are international medical graduates (IMGs). This percentage is even higher for those training in the BSW area.

Many of these doctors who are on Skilled Worker Visa (formerly Tier 2 Visa) are typically not eligible for indefinite leave to remain (ILR) in the UK when they qualify and must be employed by a practice with a Visa Sponsorship Licence to continue working in the UK.

In BSW many of the IMGs completing their GP training would like to stay in the area and are looking for employment. But only 15 of 87 (17%) BSW practices currently hold Visa Sponsorship Licences.

You can help support them into employment with your organisation by becoming a visa sponsor. The next 3 practices that come forward to apply for a Visa Sponsorship Licence will be supported by the BSW Training Hub.

FOCUS ON - Trainee Nursing Associates and Registered Nursing Associates in Primary Care

What is a Registered Nursing Associate (RNA)?

The Nursing Associate role was developed in 2015 to increase the capacity of the nursing workforce, bridging the gap between Healthcare Assistants and Registered Nurses (RNs). It offers career development opportunities for current staff and an alternative route to becoming a Registered Nurse. Trainee Nursing Associates (TNAs) complete a 2 year foundation degree by **apprenticeship**, with time equally spent between higher education and clinical placements within a range of different settings to gain experience across the four fields of nursing (adult, child, learning disability, mental health). On qualification, they can apply for Registration with the NMC, and can also undertake a further 2 year Registered Nurse Degree Apprenticeship (RNDA) programme to qualify as an RN.

Did you know that there are currently at least 22 RNAs, and 30 TNAs employed in General Practices and PCNs across BSW? This means that in BSW, we are well ahead if not taking the lead in the South West on training and establishing this new workforce in primary care. So a big **"WELL DONE"** shout-out goes to all of the practices and PCNs who have already and are currently supporting staff to complete the TNA programme.

Many, but not all of our TNAs already have rich experience of working in General Practice as HCAs or Assistant Practitioners. Others have been GP Assistants or Admin apprentices. A few are completely new to Primary Care and at least one new starter was a Sixth Form school leaver. Following the **apprenticeship programme**, TNAs work a minimum 30 hours a week and spend half of their time studying with one of the six approved universities covering the BSW area including BPP, Open University, Oxford Brookes, Solent, University of West of England, and University of Gloucester. The remainder of their time is spent working in General Practice with supervision, and in external clinical placements.

With a Government levy-transfer the **university course fees of £15,000 are paid in full**, and in addition, Primary Care employers can get a two year grant from NHSE totalling £8,160. The roles of both TNA and RNA are also reimbursable under the ARRS scheme! What's not to like?

Whilst it can seem overly complicated and perhaps daunting to set about employing a TNA in General Practice, there are colleagues within the Training Hub whose specific role it is to guide and support you through the stages of applying for an apprenticeship, funding, and university provider for your prospective TNA. You can contact us for an initial discussion whatever stage of planning and thinking your GP practice or PCN is at. I would be delighted to work with you on this in my role as TNA Lead. I work extremely closely with colleagues Petra Freeman and Kevin Foreman, so between us we have the knowledge and experience to help you get this off the ground. My role is also to support employers and TNAs along the two year programme, and to contribute towards their retention in the Primary Care workforce. If you are a TNA currently studying, or a qualified NA just registering with the NMC, or pioneering the RNA role primary care, I would love to hear from you! I am actively developing a Peer Support Network for TNAs and RNAs, with the launch of TNAs Together at the end of February. The network will have several layers employing a number of communication methods including the TNAs Together WhatsApp group, regular information and relevant updates by email, meetings on Teams, and hopefully an initial face to face event in the early Summer. As I write this, seven TNAs are members of the WhatsApp group so please join us. Setting up a peer support Network will allow TNAs across different Primary Care settings to connect with their peers, share experiences, challenges, and solutions and to learn with others.
